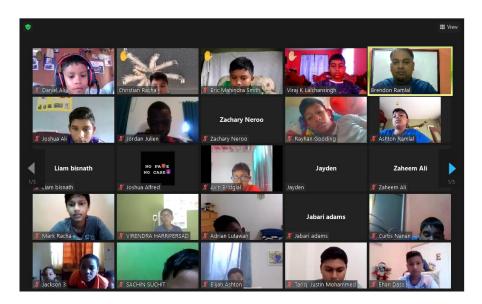
- 1. Time Management
