"Canada Yield Price" means a price equal to the price for the Senior Notes to be redeemed, calculated on the business day immediately preceding the date on which the Bank gives notice of the redemption of the Senior Notes, to provide an annual yield thereon from the date fixed for redemption to, but excluding, the Maturity Date equal to the GOC Redemption Yield (as defined below) plus $0.33 \%$.
"GOC Redemption Yield" on any date shall mean the arithmetic average of the interest rates quoted to the Bank by two registered Canadian investment dealers selected by the Bank, as being the annual mid-market yield to maturity on such date, compounded semiannually, which a non-callable Government of Canada bond would carry if issued, in Canadian dollars in Canada, at $100 \%$ of its principal amount on the date of redemption to the Maturity Date.

Any redemption will be subject to the prior approval of the Superintendent of Financial Institutions (the "Superintendent") if such redemption would lead to a breach of the Bank's Total Loss Absorbing Capacity ("TLAC") requirements.
